FIELD NOTES

Redlair Nature Preserve and Catawba Conservancy Property

On June 22, 2013, a team of malacologists from the Schiele Museum of Natural History Malacology Mini-Conference surveyed the Red Lair property for terrestrial snail species. The time spent on the site was only about one hour, however the team had 11 experienced researchers. The area searched was behind the Rankin residence above the creek. The terrain was sloped with young hardwoods and *Magnolia macrophylla*. The team looked under leaf litter, rotting logs, and collected soil samples that were later examined in the lab. Some snails were found near the residence around the steps. A total of 26 species of land snails were found. Two additional species have been found previously in a different part of the property. Around 75 species are possible in the southern Piedmont, so this was a substantial number for one site. Especially encouraging was the presence of five species of Mantleslugs, native woodland slug species. Exotic invasive species are marked (*) and were found mostly near the residence.
